MYNYDD MAEN COMMON.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Mynydd Maen, Mynydd Llwyd, Edlogan, Marna Porta, Mynydd Henllys and Twm Barlwm, being wholly or partly situated within an area which immediately before 1 April 1974 was a borough or urban district is subject to the provisions of Section 193 of the Law of Property Act 1925, whereby the public have rights of access to these commons for air and exercise, and the Secretary of State on the application of the Mynydd Maen Commoners' Association, being the persons entitled to commonable rights affecting the land, has made an Order under the said Section imposing limitations and conditions as to the said rights of access. and may be seen at all reasonable hours.

THE FOLLOWING are the limitations and conditions imposed by the Order:

SCHEDULE

WITHOUT LAWFUL AUTHORITY no person shall in or upon the land;

- a. Discharge any missile to the danger of any other person (or creature) on the ground.
- b. Kill, take, molest or wilfully disturb any animal or bird or take or injure any egg or nest or engage in hunting or shooting or the setting of traps or nets or the laying of snares.
- c. Cause or permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge to go or remain on the land unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person and worrying or disturbing any animal or water fowl.
- d. Bring or cause to be brought any cattle, sheep, goats or pigs or any beast of draught or burden: provided that this shall not be deemed to prohibit the riding or leading of any horse on any of the bridle paths.
- e. Bathe, wade or wash in any lake, pond, stream or other water.
- f. Affix any bill, placard or notice to or upon any wall, fence, tree or plant or to or upon any part of any building, barrier, railing, seat or of any other erection or ornament.
- g. (i) Erect any post, rail, fence, pole, tent, booth, stand, building or other structure.  
(ii) Take part in any public show or performance.
- h. Feed, interfere with or molest any of the animals who are turned out on to the land in the exercise of rights common.
- i. No person shall cause or permit any model aircraft powered by an internal combustion type engine to take off,

ANYONE who fails to observe any of the above limitations or conditions will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £20 for each offence.

NOTE

The public are reminded that the commission of such acts as are listed in the left-hand column below may be an infringement of the corresponding enactment listed in the right-hand column.

Drive vehicles or camp or light fires without lawful authority.

Section 193 of the Law of Property Act 1925

Create any nuisance or disturbance, use obscene language or behave in an indecent or disorderly manner to the annoyance of any person.

Section 5 of the Public Order Act 1936

Kill, injure or take any protected wild bird; take, damage or destroy the nest of any protected wild bird while that nest is in use; take or destroy an egg from any nest of a protected wild bird.

Section 1 of the Protection of Birds Act 1954

Deposit any thing causing or tending to cause defacement by litter.

Litter Act 1958

Remove gravel, sand, soil, turf or manure.

Criminal Damage Act 1971, Theft Act 1968

Take or attempt to take fish from any pond or stream.

Section 32 and Schedule 1 of the Theft Act 1968

Damage or destroy trees, saplings shrubs, gorse or underwood or set fire to heath, gorse or fern.

Criminal Damage Act 1971.

Injure notice boards, seats or receptacles for rubbish.

Criminal Damage Act 1971 .

Injure or disfigure any ancient monument or earthwork or object of historical, scientific or antiquarian interest.

Criminal Damage Act 1971

Carry firearms with ammunition.

Section 19 of the Firearms Act 1968.
